# General Information for 2019 Years 7 - 12

## **Department of Education Information on School Contributions and Charges:**

### **Parent/Guardian**

Section 12 of the Schools Education Act gives Public Government Secondary Schools the authority to set and collect school charges within set guidelines. Copies of the relevant section of the Schools Education Act can be obtained on request.

### **LOWER SCHOOL**

The basic charge of \$235 provides class room sets of textbooks, daily classroom consumables and information technology facilities.

Students need to provide personal stationery requirements such as files, pens, paper and calculators.

**All students are responsible for provision of personal stationery items necessary for the subjects they study as per the stationery list. These may be purchased from local shopping centre suppliers at reasonable prices. These are necessary items for effective learning to take place. It is NOT the school's responsibility to supply such items.**

### **Electives**

Electives outside the basic core program **will incur additional charges above** the basic charge of \$235.

**Charges for Electives are required to be paid at the start of the school year.** In order for students to be successful in being allocated to elective classes of choice, it is expected that a deposit is paid for enrolment in the selected elective. Please refer to the Non Payment of School Contributions and Charges section.

### **SENIOR SCHOOL**

**50% of contributions and charges are required to be paid at the start of the school year.**

Charges will depend upon the course chosen. Please refer to the Non Payment of School Contributions and Charges section.

Some specific courses will incur high costs dependent upon such items as textbooks, subject specific resources, materials, excursions, certificates and work placement. Students involved in **work placement must pay the associated contributions and charges prior to commencement** of the work placement.

**Students are responsible for provision of personal stationery items such as paper, pens, rulers etc, lever arch file, dividers, plastic expander file, A4 sheet protectors and divider notebooks. These may be purchased from local shopping centre suppliers at reasonable prices. These are necessary items for effective learning to take place. It is NOT the school's responsibility to supply such items.**

### **Voluntary Charges**

These are set for Amenities, Parents and Citizens Association, Homework Diary and Chaplaincy. Please see section on optional charges.

## **Non-Payment Of Charges**

School charges are due at the commencement of the school year. Secondary assistance, part payments, instalment agreements or periodic bank debits **are to be organised with the Manager Corporate Services before the end of Term 1.**

### **Non-commitment by the End of Term 1**

If charges are not paid or arrangements to pay have not been made with the Manager Corporate Services by the end of Term 1:

- Students will be **unable to attend extra non-curricular activities** such as excursions, camps and organised school activities.
- Lower school students **may be moved from electives**, which are outside the basic core program, to other units.

### **Non-commitment by the End of April**

If arrangements to pay money owing have not been made by the end of April, students **will be placed in basic core electives for the following year.**

While these arrangements are not the preferred management method by the school, it is important that all parents pay school charges. It is not fair for parents who do not pay the charges to be subsidised by those who do pay.

## **Parents/Guardians are asked to pay the following optional charges:**

### **AMENITIES**

An administrative charge of **\$10.00** per student is payable to the school. Funds derived from this levy are used to cover costs of newsletters, brochures and programs and to support expenditure on items such as photocopiers and audiovisual equipment.

### **P&C**

A **family** charge of **\$25.00**. This will enable the P&C to purchase much needed equipment for students' use and relieve the pressure of a few volunteers to raise funds. Throughout the years, the P&C has supported many activities such as Country Week, Year 12 Presentation Night and the School Ball. Karratha Senior High School P&C do not conduct regular raffles, fetes or other activities, which require parents volunteering their time.

### **SCHOOL DIARY**

A charge of **\$15.00** is payable for a school specific diary which includes information such as the school map, study planner, important dates and several helpful hints and tips.

### **BUS EXCURSION**

The Bus Excursion charge of **\$11.00** contributes towards the cost of using the KSHS bus. Bus Excursion Fees not paid at the beginning of the year will incur costs on a per student per excursion basis.

### **YEARBOOK**

Students/parents have the option of purchasing a School Yearbook at a cost of **\$25.00**.

## **Other items required:**

### **SAFETY GLASSES**

It is an **Occupational Health and Safety Requirement** of the school that students must have a pair of Approved Safety Glasses for all Design and Technology and Science classes. These are available through the Uniform Shop for **\$5.00**.

### **CALCULATORS**

# General Information for 2019

## Senior School
